Richard Shephard enjoys an international reputation as a composer of church music. For many years, he was the Head Master of the Minster School, York, and Chamberlain of York Minster, where he is now Director of Development. He is a Visiting Fellow of the Music Department at the University of York and a Visiting Professor at the University of the South, Sewanee, Tennessee. He has served on the Archbishop's Commission on Church Music and on the Church Music Commission on Cathedrals. His *Song of Mary*, a metrical setting of the Magnificat, was commissioned by the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham to celebrate the Second Millennium of the Lord's birth. It was first performed in York Minster in May of 2000.

Indodana is a traditional South African song arranged by Michael Barrett, who teaches at the University of Pretoria, and Ralf Schmitt, a renowned African choral music specialist. This moving song captures the lament of Mary and the other women after the death of Jesus and the pain of the tortured Christ as he cries out *Holololo*.

This arrangement by American composer Shawn Kirchner is the first movement of *Heavenly Home: Three American Songs.* Composed for eight-part *a cappella* chorus, it is a setting of a gospel tune by J. K. Alwood. Bluegrass vocal stylings combine with counterpoint and fugue in a crescendo that peak at the words "in the city that is made of gold." The work was first performed in 2010 by the Los Angeles Master Chorale.

"Amazing Grace" is one of the most recognizable English-language songs and has been recorded over 6,600 times. Mack Wilberg, director the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, arranged this version of "Amazing Grace," which starts with the men singing in unison, gradually adds vocal parts, and builds to an awe-inspiring culmination of harmonies. Of the hymn itself Wilberg said: "it's a perfect marriage of text and tune ... it just resonates in a way that few other hymns do," adding that "it has universal appeal."

The lyrics to the hymn were written by English poet and clergyman John Newton and were published in 1779. Growing up without religious faith, Newton wrote the words from personal experience: his spiritual conversion came while he was aboard a ship during a violent storm, and called out to God for mercy. Although the hymn has been set to more than twenty melodies, it was set to a tune named "New Britain" in 1835, which is the melody most commonly heard today.

Kinetic Dances (2014)

Randall Standridge earned music degrees from Arkansas State University. He is a freelance composer, marching band designer, photographer, and writer. Mr. Standridge has a knack for creating interesting music that appeals to student musicians. *Kinetic Dances* has allowed us to explore the meter of 7/8. In doing so, the students have gained extra experience understanding accurate rhythm and counting. The composition was commissioned by the Yoe High School Band in Texas for their performance at the 2014 Texas Music Educators Association State Conference.

An American Elegy (2000)

Of An American Elegy, Frank Ticheli wrote: "An American Elegy is, above all, an expression of hope. It was composed in memory of those who lost their lives at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999, and to honor the survivors. It is offered as a tribute to their great strength and courage in the face of a terrible tragedy. I hope the work can also serve as one reminder of how fragile and precious life is and how intimately connected we all are as human beings ... three moods—hope, serenity, and sadness—become intertwined throughout the work, defining its complex expressive character." A native of Louisiana, Dr. Ticheli holds the D.M.A. degree in composition from the University of Michigan. His principal teachers included William Albright, Leslie Bassett, William Bolcom, and George Wilson. Dr. Ticheli teaches at the University of Southern California and has earned many awards for his compositions. He is unique among composers with the ability to write equally well for educational purposes and also at the highest artistic level.

Sesenta (2019)

Dr. Quincy Hilliard is a prolific composer who has been honored many times, including the Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Award in 2014, and a commission to write music for the Olympics in 1996. He teaches at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette, where he is a colleague of LSM trumpet instructor Dr. Paul Morton. Tonight, you are hearing the second performance of *Sesenta*. The work was commissioned by the Michigan City (Indiana) Municipal Band (MCMB), and premiered on June 6 of this year. I've been the conductor of the MCMB since 2014. *Sesenta* celebrates Dr. Guy Foreman's 60 years of conducting the MCMB. The title is Spanish for "60." *Sesenta* is joyous, majestic, lyrical, fast, slow, loud, and soft. In a collaboration between the MCMB and LSM, we're excited that Dr. Hilliard will visit LSM next week to work with the band on *Sesenta* and another of his compositions, *Octane*. He will also meet with the LSM composition students while he is in town, and conduct both *Sesenta* and *Octane* with the MCMB on July 11.

CONDUCTORS

Kevin F. E. Sütterlin is Director of Orchestral Activities and Opera and Assistant Professor of Instrumental Conducting at Concordia College, where he is Music Director and Conductor of The Concordia Orchestra and Concordia Opera. Sütterlin is third prize winner of the prestigious American Prize in Orchestral Conducting 2017. He is an awardee of the Hirschmann Foundation scholarship of Switzerland, the Hendrickson Fine Arts Grant, the University of Memphis International Research scholarship, and the University of Memphis Creative Achievement Award. Championing new music, Sütterlin has commissioned and recorded works of numerous living composers, including René Clausen, Adam Hochstatter, Paul Cravens, and Doug Harbin, among others, and is one of the leading scholars of the music of American composer Dominick Argento. Sütterlin received his doctorate and master's degrees in orchestral conducting from the University of Memphis and a bachelor's degree in conducting from the Hochschule Luzern–Musik, Switzerland.

Nancy Menk holds the Mary Lou and Judd Leighton Chair in Music at Saint Mary's College, Notre Dame, Indiana, where she is Professor of Music, Director of Choral Activities, and Chair of the Music Department. She also teaches graduate conducting at the University of Notre Dame. She is founder and conductor of the South Bend Chamber Singers, an ensemble of 32 select singers from the Michiana area. Both the Saint Mary's Women's Choir and the South Bend Chamber Singers regularly commission, perform, and record new works. Dr. Menk is also conductor of the 110-voice Northwest Indiana Symphony Chorus. She has conducted All-State Choirs in Colorado, Delaware, Indiana, Kentucky, North Dakota, Maryland, and Pennsylvania. Menk is Editor of the Saint Mary's College Choral Series, published by *earthsongs*. In October 2016, she became the first woman to program and lead a subscription concert of the South Bend Symphony Orchestra. In March 2019, she made her sixth Carnegie Hall appearance conducting a program of music for women's voices and orchestra.

Jeffrey Scott Doebler serves as Professor of Music and director of music education and bands at Valparaiso University. On November 3, 2018, Dr. Doebler was named a *Distinguished Hoosier* by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb. Professor Doebler holds music education degrees from Luther College (B.A.), Valparaiso University (M.M.), and the University of Minnesota (Ph.D.). The recipient of numerous awards for teaching excellence, he is equally effective working with younger students, older students, and professional musicians. Dr. Doebler has appeared professionally in 30 states, Canada, Malta, Australia, New Zealand, Italy, and China. In a typical year he works with more than 3,000 students.

Hymn Commission

O God, Our Help in Ages Past

In 2016, we implemented the LSM Half Session Concert. In an excellent example of music education in action, the Half Session Concert also allowed us to combine the LSM choir, orchestra, and band for the closing work. To further this tradition, my wife (Karen) and I commissioned our good friend Michael Boo to create a finale selection that would reflect Lutheran Summer Music. O God, Our Help in Ages Past (St. Anne) is a favorite hymn of ours, and one that is published in each of the Lutheran hymnals I own (ELW 632, LSB 733, LBW 320, LW 180, TLH 123, SBH 168, LH 556). It is also a hymn that is associated with Valparaiso University. We process to it each year in our opening convocation, and the hymn was described by former university administrators Richard Baepler and Roy Austensen as the unofficial anthem of Valparaiso University. Since Lutheran Music Program and Valparaiso University share the pan-Lutheran tradition, it seemed an ideal choice. I asked Michael Boo to

create an arrangement that would work well for the combined groups, and that would allow strings, woodwinds, brass, percussion, organ, student voices, and congregation to be featured. Karen and I hope this arrangement will serve the church by joining other long-standing traditions at Lutheran Summer Music. Press on!
