To thee cherubim and seraphim continually do cry, "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Sabaoth; heaven and earth are full of the majesty of thy glory." The glorious company of the apostles praise thee. The goodly fellowship of the prophets praise thee. The noble army of martyrs praise thee. The holy Church throughout all the world doth acknowledge thee; the Father of an infinite majesty; thine honorable, true and only Son; also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.

Thou art the King of glory, O Christ, thou art the everlasting Son of the Father. When thou tookest upon thee to deliver man, thou didst not abhor the Virgin's womb. When thou hadst overcome the sharpness of death, thou didst open the kingdom of heaven to all believers. Thou sittest at the right hand of God in the glory of the Father. 
Alleluia


Holy Gospel

Reading of St. Matthew 13: 1-9, the parable of the sower.




After the return of the Gospel Procession and the conclusion of the fanfare, all are seated.





In our celebration of Holy Communion today we rejoice to receive the crucified and risen Lord, truly present in the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. By water and the Word we are God's new creation, sustained as we partake of this one holy food.

Baptized and communing Christians who desire to receive the Sacrament today may approach one of the stations by the center aisle, at the direction of the ushers. The body of Christ is given in the palm of the hand. Those drinking from the cup then go to the *first* chalice (immediately next to the minister of the bread) to receive the blood of Christ. Those receiving by intinction (dipping the bread into the cup), go to the *second* chalice at each station. Those who do not wish to commune are welcome to receive a blessing. Please approach with open hands to receive the elements, with folded hands to receive a blessing.
