



Those drinking from the cup then go to the first chalice (nearest the presiding minister) to receive the blood of Christ. Those receiving by Intinction (dipping the bread into the cup), go to the second chalice on either side. Those who do not wish to commune are welcome to receive a blessing. Please approach with open hands to receive the elements, with folded hands to receive a blessing.
