

**HOLY COMMUNION:** All baptized Christians who commune in their home congregations are welcome at the Lord's Table. In Holy Communion we receive the crucified and risen Christ who is truly present in the bread and wine, and in our community gathered to eat and drink these gifts of God.

Those who desire to receive the Sacrament are invited to use the two center aisles to receive the bread, then move to the sides, left or right, to receive the wine from one of the assisting ministers. Wine is available either by common cup or intinction (dipping the bread into the wine). Those who do not wish to commune are welcome to come forward for a blessing. Please approach the table with open hands to receive the element and with folded hands to receive a blessing.

OUR OFFERING today is designated for Lutheran World Relief, an agency devoted to world hunger.

THE COVER ART depicts a verse from our gospel today: "whoever gives a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple - none of these will lose their reward." As Christ welcomes us in baptism we are called to welcome others with God's unconditional love and grace.

Mr. Weiger is the oboe professor at the University of Iowa and chair of the woodwind area. As a soloist in the past six years, he has performed in 38 states, Canada, England, Italy, France, and Austria. He has recorded on the CRS and Chandos labels. Mr. Weiger has been principal oboe with the Kansas City Symphony and Chamber Orchestra, the Illinois Symphony and Chamber Orchestra, the Virginia Chamber Orchestra, Albany (NY), Portland (ME), Vermont, and New Hampshire Symphony Orchestras as well as the Great Music West Festival, Cascades and Britt (OR) Festivals, New Hampshire Festival, and Yellow Barn (VT). He is also a member of Wizards! The Double Reed Consort.

Mr. Conway is a member of the Detroit Symphony as well as several music festivals including Great Music West and Breckenridge, and is on the faculty at Wayne State University. He has premiered and recorded numerous American works and is represented as a soloist by the Great Lakes Performing Artists Associates.
