Conductor Christopher M. Cock is Director of Choral and Vocal Activities and Reddel Professor of Music at Valparaiso University (IN). He conducts the Valparaiso University Chorale, University Singers, and teaches conducting and voice. Prior to his appointment to VU, Dr. Cock was Associate Professor of Music Concordia College, Moorhead, MN. As a solo artist his extensive range and communicative performances have established him as a premier lyric tenor. His performances as a Bach *Evangelist* are taking him to concert venues throughout the United States, including appearances with the Florida Orchestra, The Los Angeles Master Chorale and Bach festivals in Michigan, Kansas and California. He has twice been the featured tenor soloist at the internationally renowned Oregon Bach Festival, lead by German conductor Helmuth Rilling. He has on numerous occasions appeared as a soloist with Maestro Robert Shaw. His performances with the Robert Shaw Festival Singers can be heard on recordings released by Telac International, including Francis Poulenc: Mass and Motets, Amazing Grace: American Hymns and Spirituals, and Songs of Angels (Christmas Music).

Dr. Cock studied at the University of Southern California and completed undergraduate degrees at Pacific Lutheran University. He has a Doctor of Musical Arts degree completed at the University of Arizona (Tucson) in 1987. He is an active clinician and guest conductor.

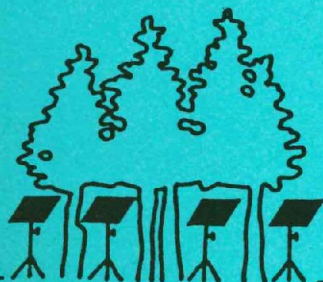

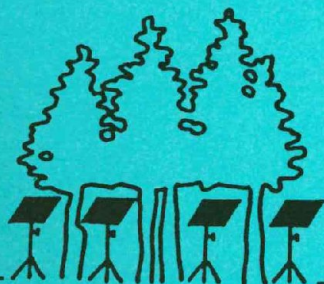
