James M. Klein is Professor of Music at California State University, Stanislaus where he is conductor of the Stanislaus Symphony Orchestra. He also serves as Conductor of the Senior Division of the Modesto Symphony Youth Orchestra. Active as a guest conductor, he has conducted throughout the U.S. as well as four conducting tours of the former Soviet Union conducting the Kiev Chamber Orchestra, the Crimea Philharmonic, the Donetsk Philharmonic, the Knepopetrovsk Philharmonic, and the Lugansk Philharmonic in performances critically acclaimed. In addition to the All-State Orchestras of California and Nebraska, he has served as guest conductor for numerous regional honor orchestras throughout California and other states. This season, Dr. Klein returned to Ukraine for a concert with the Lyov Philharmonic Orchestra, one of four conductors chosen internationally to conduct at the Beethoven Festival. Other highlights of this season include serving as Assistant Conductor for the National High School Honors Orchestra in Kansas City in April besides returning here to Lutheran Summer Music as orchestra conductor.

Dr. Klein has served as Coordinator of Instrumental Music at the California State Summer School for the Arts, as President of the California Orchestra Directors Association, and as Orchestra Representative for the California Music Educators Association and now serves on the board of the National School Orchestra Association as Public Relations Chair.

He holds the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees with high honors from the University of Texas, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. Weston Noble, director of music activities at Luther College, is an internationally known conductor and clinician. He has served as guest conductor for more than 275 music festivals in the United States and abroad. He has adjudicated at the International Festival of Three Cities (Vienna, Budapest, and Prague) and served as the band consultant and guest director of the Association for International Cultural Exchange in Vienna.

In 1995, Noble was the guest conductor of the Australian National Choral Association in Perth, Australia.

Noble received the first Outstanding Music Educator Award from the National Federation of High School Associations in recognition of his contributions to the quality of performance in high school music programs. He has also received the Iowa Music Educators Association's Outstanding Music Educator Award, the Illinois Music Educators Association's Presidential Award and the Citation of Merit from the University of Michigan.

Dennis Friesen-Carper conducts the Symphony and Chamber Orchestras, and teaches composition at Valparaiso University, in Valparaiso, Indiana. In his sixth year as Music Director for Indiana Opera North, he has worked as festival conductor and clinician from Texas to Ontario, and performed in over forty states, Canada, Europe, Korea and Japan. His works have been commissioned by the Houston Symphony, Lake Superior Chamber Orchestra, South Bend Symphony, Houston Chamber Singers, and the Valparaiso University Kantorei.

Mr. Friesen-Carper holds Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees from the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Bethel College, and has performed extensively as a jazz pianist.
