Dr. Scott R. Johnson is completing his fourth year at Augustana College as Director of Orchestra and Director of Music Education. This year, he will be granted tenure, promoted to Associate Professor, and appointed department chair. After earning a Bachelor of Arts degree with emphasis in orchestral conducting from Macalester College, in St. Paul, Minnesota, he received the Master of Music in orchestral conducting from Illinois State University in Normal, and the Doctor of Philosophy in music education from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. He previously served as Coordinator of Instrumental Music at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania and Director of Orchestral Studies at the University of Central Arkansas, Conway.

Before he entered the field of music education, Dr. Johnson served several years as a minister of music for churches in Minnesota and Illinois. He has also served as music director of the Illinois Valley Symphony Orchestra and choral and orchestra director at Pekin, Illinois, Community High School. He was the founder and conductor of the Peoria Chamber Orchestra—an orchestra comprised of area music educators. Since 1970, he has conducted youth orchestras in Arkansas, Illinois, and Minnesota. He is recognized as a conductor, clinician, and adjudicator of music festivals throughout the Midwest. In addition, he has been actively involved with community musical theater and is presently associated with the Sioux Falls Community Playhouse.

A bassist with the South Dakota Symphony, he has served as either principal or section bassist with 14 different orchestras in South Dakota, Arkansas, Illinois, and Minnesota. He also has been a free-lance jazz/pop bassist for the past 30 years throughout the Midwest performing with such artists as Pearl Bailey, Doc Severinson, and George Burns. Teaching, conducting, performing; developing and managing college, community, and youth orchestras; musical theater, opera, church, and choral work are all

part of his musical interest, expertise, and experience.

Henry Charles Smith is in his ninth season as Music Director and Conductor of the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra. He has conducted the Young Artist Orchestra at Tanglewood and was Music Director of the World Youth Symphony Orchestra at Interlochen Arts Camp for sixteen years. While on the conducting staff of the Minnesota Orchestra, he conducted over 1,000 concerts. His guest conducting appearances include the Detroit, Dallas, Kansas City, Minnesota, San Antonio, and Indianapolis Symphonies, and the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra.

As solo trombonist with the Philadelphia Orchestra, he played more than 2,000 concerts with Eugene Ormandy and many other of the 20th century's greatest conductors. As trombone and euphonium soloist, as chamber music player, and as writer and editor, his recordings and editions are internationally known. In 1969 he won a Grammy Award with the Philadelphia Brass Quintet

for the "Best Classical Record of the Year."

He has served on the faculties of the Curtis Institute of Music, Indiana University, Temple University, the University of Texas, St. Olaf College, Luther College, and Bethel College. He is Professor Emeritus at Arizona State University. He is a frequent guest conductor, speaker, clinician, and soloist across the United States.




All praise to thee, my God this night for all the blessings of the light. Keep me, oh, keep me King of kings, beneath thine own almighty wings.


