

Aaron Douglas based this painting on the James Weldon Johnson's poem "The Creation." In the poem God steps out on space; spangles the night with moon and stars; claps hands so that the thunder rolls; raises an arm so that birds split the air with their wings; scoops up clay from a river bed "like a mammy bending over her baby"; and breathes the breath of life into the clay - creating human beings. A tree lingers nearby - perhaps the tree of life and death on which Christ creates salvation.







Fulfilled is all that David told In true prophetic song of old, That God the nations' king should be And reign in triumph from the tree.


O tree of beauty, tree most fair, Ordained those holy limbs to bear: Gone is your shame, each crimsoned bough Proclaims the King of glory now.
