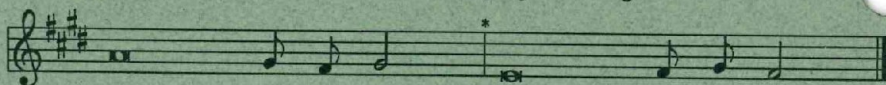

In the poem God steps out on space; spangles the night with moon and stars; claps hands so that the thunder rolls; raises an arm so that birds split the air with their wings; scoops up clay from a river bed "like a mammy bending over her baby"; and breathes the breath of life into the clay - creating human beings. A tree lingers nearby - perhaps the tree of life and death on which Christ creates salvation.
