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**Michael Acord** is currently Assistant Professor of Music at Morehead State University, Kentucky, and principal clarinet of the Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra. He studied at Michigan State University and the Eastman School of Music.

**Seth Beckman** has received numerous honors and awards, both as a soloist and chamber musician, and has appeared in recital throughout the United States and Europe. He is Associate Professor of Piano and Chair of the Music Department at Bemidji State University.

Antoni Bonetti is currently Head of Orchestral Studies at St. Peters Lutheran College, Brisbane, Australia, and founder and Music Director of the Brisbane Sinfonia. An accomplished violinist, Mr. Bonetti was formerly concertmaster of the Norrlands Opera, Sweden, and the Queensland Theatre Orchestra. He has performed, conducted, adjudicated, and given master classes across Australia, New Zealand, and Europe.

Ruth Bonetti has performed, taught, and given seminars in England, Sweden, Germany, France, and Denmark. For fifteen years she taught clarinet and pedagogy at the Brisbane Conservatorium at Griffith University, but since the publication of her book *Taking Centre - Stage* she now enjoys the freedom to present seminars in Australia's leading schools and colleges. She is the author of *Enjoy Playing the Clarinet* and is currently working on her next book of practice advice.

Cathy Collinge Herrera teaches flute, music cultures, and music appreciation at Valparaiso University. A former Fulbright scholar, she has performed and taught throughout the Americas, Australia, and England. She received her Doctor of Musical Arts degree and Certificate in World Music from Florida State University.

James Hogg received his Bachelor of Music degree from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London, England, and his Master of Music from Arizona State University. He is currently a C.V. Starr Doctoral Fellow at the Juilliard School in New York and has won numerous awards and prizes including the Music Teachers National Association Collegiate Artist Competition.

**Beth Ray** is Assistant Professor of Voice at Ithaca College in New York. She is active in oratorios, operas, and recitals, throughout the region. She was chosen for the 1999 NATS Intern Program and is completing a doctorate degree from the University of Texas, Austin.

Ruth Sall is beginning her second year as Adjunct Instructor of Voice at St. Olaf College. A graduate student at the University of Minnesota, Ruth has performed roles with the University Opera Emsemble. She has also appeared with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra as part of a St. Olaf faculty sextet. Ruth has won numerous awards for young musicians and has participated in master classes with notable vocalists. She is currently a student of Glenda Maurice.

**Timothy Schorr** is Assistant Professor of Music and Coordinator of Applied Piano and Pedagogy at Viterbo College in La Crosse, Wisconsin. He made his New York debut in Weill Recital Hall, was a coach-accompanist for both the Cincinnati and Dayton opera companies and has performed as a soloist and collaborator throughout the Midwest. He holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

**Timothy Smith** is Assistant Professor of Piano and Music Theory at Arkansas Tech University. He has recorded the Suzuki cello repertoire with renowned cellist Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi. He is also the official pianist for the D'Angelo Competition in Strings. He holds a Bachelor's degree from St. Olaf College and graduate degrees from Indiana University.

Katherine Vogele currently serves as Principal Flute of the South Dakota Symphony and the Dakota Wind Quintet.
