She received a Ph.D. in musicology from the Eastman School of Music in 1991 with a dissertation on the sacred works of Antoine Busnoys. Her areas of research include 15th-century Burgundian music, music in convents, and women in music. She is also interested in ethnomusicology and has traveled to Ghana and Bali for research on women's music. Natvig plays, performs, and teaches violin and Baroque violin. Her teachers include Abram Loft, Sylvia Rosenberg, Oliver Steiner, and Charles Castleman.
