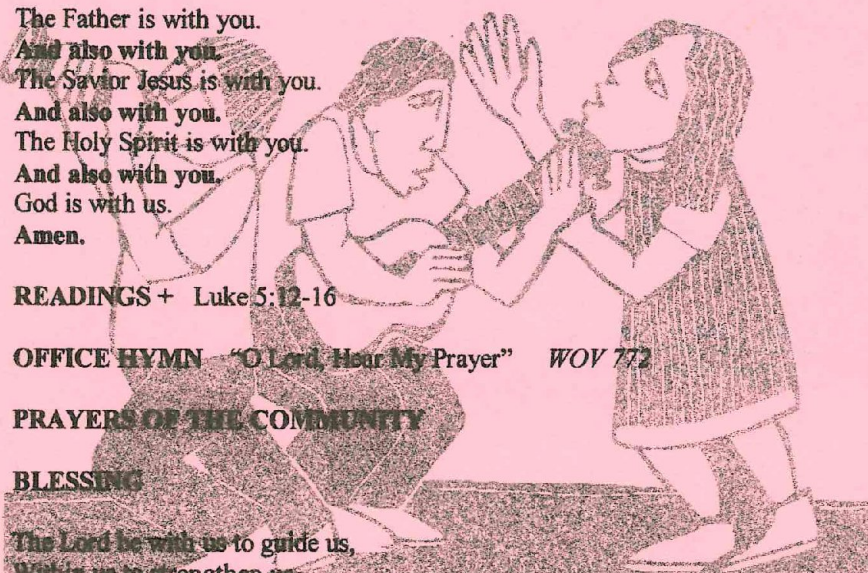


Today ask God to help you see the value of withdrawing unto him.
Aloneness can be blessed when God is in it. It was the pattern of our Lord Jesus to withdraw and be alone with God. It is a good thing to enter into his rest.




