Amen.

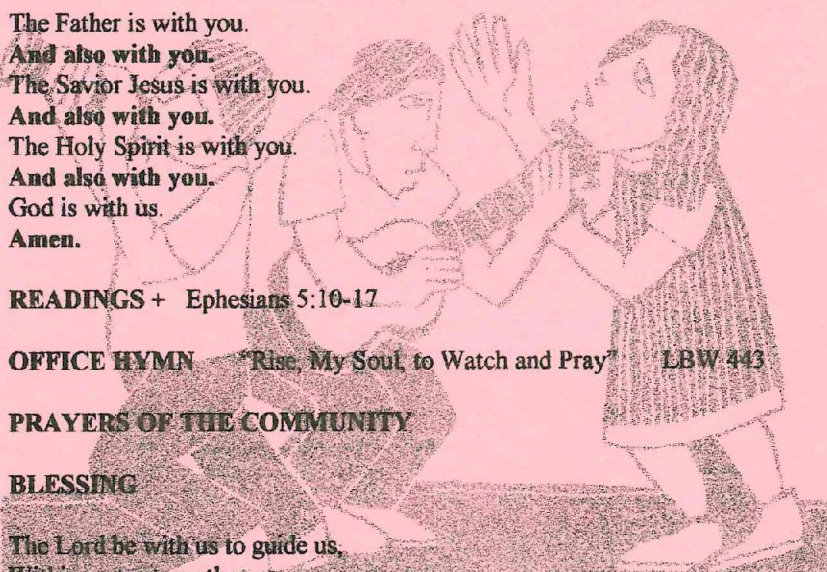
