Amen.

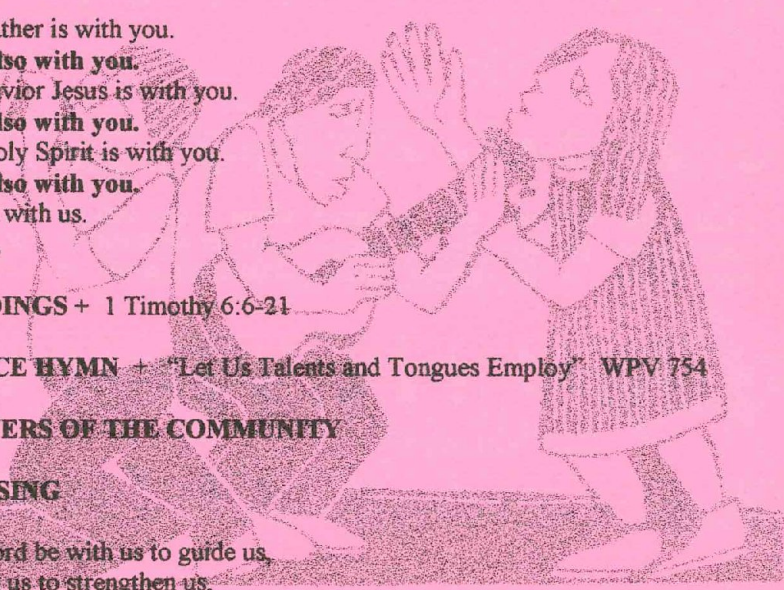
