REQUIRED COURSES & ACTIVITIES

Primary Lessons—Individual instruction is offered on all orchestral and band instruments, voice, piano, and organ. All students take two 25-minute lessons each week in their first instrument or in voice.

Large Ensemble—All students (including pianists and organists) are assigned to a large ensemble such as symphony orchestra, concert band, or a major choral ensemble. While every effort will be made to honor student preferences for ensembles, placement in large ensembles is determined by auditions, schedules, and ensemble requirements.

Small Ensemble—Small musical ensembles are a hallmark of this music camp. All students belong to chamber ensembles (string quartets, brass and woodwind quintets, keyboard and vocal ensembles, etc.) at appropriate levels of advancement as determined by auditions and subsequent progress. Ensembles rehearse regularly each week.

Music Literature and Musicianship—To develop musicianship and musical perspective, all students study works of great composers and principles of musicianship. Placement tests will determine musicianship section assignments.

Concerts and Recitals-Regular attendance at musical performances at camp is required.

OPTIONAL COURSES

Additional Lessons—Students may choose to take one or two optional lessons per week in a second instrument or in voice.

Additional Large Ensemble—Students may participate in one additional large ensemble.

Enrichment Areas—Students may choose a course in areas such as theatre, dance, or art depending on their interest and previous experience. These classes may be cancelled due to insufficient registration. Classes meet three times per week.

Optional Ensembles—Jazz Ensemble, Handbell Ensemble, and Collegium Musicum (historical instruments) are elective options. Each group rehearses two or three times per week.

Worship and Church Music Courses—Worship provides a natural outlet for the performance of music by Christians. Students learn much about church music just by participating in daily worship, and for many, by singing in the Chapel Choir. Classes in church music, hymnody, and worship planning are offered three times weekly for those who want to learn more about music leadership in the church.

Conducting-Instruction in conducting instrumental and vocal ensembles is offered each week.

ARIA/CONCERTO AUDITIONS

All students accepted in the camp are eligible to audition without extra charge for a solo performance with the Symphony Orchestra during the concluding LSM Festival. To enter, students must submit a separate audition tape (received by LMP by May 15), which is to be a movement of a concerto or concert aria, with accompaniment, chosen from the standard repertoire. Finalists for the live audition at camp will be selected from the tape auditions. The decision of the jurors at the live audition will be final. The jurors also reserve the right not to name a concerto or aria performer.

STUDENT LIFE

Campus-LSM 2001 will be held on the campus of Augsburg College in Minneapolis, Minnesota

Housing and Meals—Students, counselors, faculty, and staff live as a community on campus Students are housed in double rooms in modern dormitories. Laundry facilities are available with in the residence hall. Meals are served cafeteria style. Food preparation is not allowed in the livin quarters.

Counseling—The Chaplain, the Dean of Students, and adult residence counselors are available t assist students to make the most of the many opportunities for personal and musical growth and fc individual attention when needed. All instructors are prepared to support students in matters relaing to their musical progress.

Worship—Christian worship is at the heart of camp life. All students participate in daily opportun ties to grow spiritually and culturally through worship as a part of the basic curriculum. They wi enjoy faculty and student musical participation at Evening Prayer and Sunday services, as well a brief performances (Abendmusik and Musical Offerings) that precede worship.

Social Life and Recreation—The camp offers daily opportunities to enjoy healthful recreation an an active social life. Programs, parties, and dances are scheduled periodically. Both supervised an free recreation are offered. Available activities include basketball, ice skating (bring your ow skates), running, volleyball, softball, tennis, aerobics, and weights.

Health Service—Professional health service is available on a daily basis. Arrangements are mad with local hospitals to provide emergency services.

Regulations—Christian behavior is expected of all students admitted into the program. Each perso is expected to abide by the code of appropriate conduct and dress that has been adopted for the we fare and benefit of all campers. Admitted students will be sent the LSM Handbook outlining cam expectations and regulations. In brief: 1. Students may not possess or use alcoholic beverages, tobac co, weapons, or unauthorized drugs. 2. Inappropriate sexual activity is not acceptable. 3. Mode and neat summer sports clothes are considered appropriate. 4. Students may not leave the cam without permission. 5. Automobiles and motorcycles are not to be operated by students during th camp; in-line skates and skateboards are prohibited; bicycles are not needed. 6. Visitors are alway welcome at LSM but must register at the camp office upon arrival. Student schedules must b respected.

OUR HISTORY

THE STORY OF LUTHERAN MUSIC PROGRAM

Nineteen years ago a group of visionary Lutheran educators and musicians conceived a program of excellence in music that would encourage youth of high school age to develop their God-given talents and to strengthen and extend the Christian tradition of fine musical performance in worship.

Aid Association for Lutherans (AAL) of Appleton, Wisconsin, supported a 1981 feasibility study that confirmed the strength of the concept. With seed money from AAL, an independent policy-making board of directors was formed and an executive director engaged.

Today LMP is supported not only by AAL, but also by Lutheran Brotherhood of Minneapolis, Minnesota; various foundations; and a national constituency of persons interested in worship, music, and the arts for young persons.

Previous Lutheran Summer Music camps have been held on various college or university campuses: Augustana (Rock Island, IL); Augustana (Sioux Falls, SD); Concordia (Moorhead, MN); Luther (Decorah, IA); St. Olaf (Northfield, MN); Valparaiso (Valparaiso, IN); and Wittenberg (Springfield, OH).



APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To be considered for admission, an applicant must mail all of the following items by May 15, 2001:

Completed application form signed by both student and parent or guardian (all students).

2. \$100 First Installment (all students).

3. Cassette tape recording(s); see following information. Note: personal musical auditions will also be given each student upon arrival at camp (new students only).

4. A musical recommendation from a music teacher or director regarding the student's ability to profit from intensive individual music study and group performance (new students only).

5. A personal recommendation from a pastor, adult leader, or teacher (in a non-music area) evaluating the student's maturity and ability to adjust to the requirements of living in a month-long summer camp environment (new students only).

Note: Applicants should send in items 1 and 2 even if items 3, 4, and 5 will be delayed.

Emphasis in admission is placed on those students of high musical ability who have demonstrated a lively interest in the affairs of their church and school and who have the capacity to work well with other students and adults. Total enrollment is usually limited and admission quotas have also been set for each vocal and instrumental area to achieve the best program for all who are admitted and to maintain a balance of ensemble membership. Some quotas are filled early. To receive full consideration for both acceptance and financial assistance, applications must be mailed to Lutheran Music Program by May 15, 2001. Preference will be given to the earliest and most qualified applicants.

TAPE AUDITION INFORMATION

1. All new students must submit with their applications a separate cassette tape of performance on each instrument (or voice) offered for either lessons or for ensemble membership. Note: Keyboard students are expected to participate in a large ensemble; therefore (for placement purposes only) they must submit a second tape in voice* or in another instrument.

2. Each recording should not exceed 15 minutes.

3. Music to be performed is the choice of the students, but the following should be included:

a. 3 scales in flat keys and 3 scales in sharp keys or equivalent vocal exercises

b. One or two solo compositions, accompanied if possible. Piano, organ, and guitar may perform without accompaniment

4. When recording, the student should clearly announce: a) his or her name, b) name of scales or compositions, c) names of composers.

5. Each cassette and cassette container must be labeled with student's name and address, name of instrument or voice, and list of pieces performed.

As soon as an application (including the tape audition) has been evaluated, a letter of acceptance or non-acceptance will be sent. If a student is not accepted, an alternate status may be assigned pending subsequent openings. A student may be admitted conditionally when the quota for the student's "first" instrument (or voice) has been filled or when an audition tape performance suggests difficulty in meeting camp standards.

All fees deposited will be returned to alternates who have not been accepted as students. An applicant accepted conditionally, who does not wish to attend camp under the conditions offered by the Program, may obtain a full refund by submitting a letter of withdrawal.

*Less experienced singers, auditioning for ensemble only, may submit a simplified voice tape which includes:

- a. one-octave scales (one high, one low) sung on "lah"
- b. a hymn melody (with accompaniment)
- c. a hymn voice-part that is not the melody (with accompaniment)

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

PROGRAM FEE

Schedule of Payments:

A first installment of the Program Fee must accompany all applications (\$100). In case of cancellation by the student, \$50 of this fee is non-refundable. For refund, written notice of cancellation must be received before April 15, 2001.



A second installment of the Program Fee must be paid within two weeks following notification of acceptance and financial aid award. This installment is non-refundable if the student subsequently cancels except in case of verified medical emergency of the student: \$300.00

A third installment of the Program Fee must be paid within one month following the due date of the second installment: \$300.00

The final installment is payable no later than June 1, 2001. It will include the unpaid remainder of the Program Fee in addition to the other fees listed below. This total may be reduced by 1) any LMP financial aid for which the student has qualified and 2) any funds that have been received by LMP from sponsors contacted

by the student (see Financial Aid Information).

FEES AND FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

The actual cost of offering Lutheran Summer Music 2001 is over \$4,000 per student. A subsidy of \$1,850 from generous donors reduces this amount to the Program Fee of \$2,150. Lutheran Music Program seeks to make it financially possible for all interested and qualified students to attend Lutheran Summer Music regardless of financial means. Generous scholarships and grants are available to help meet this goal. Last year 77 percent of our students received direct financial aid in addition to the automatic aid that all students receive.

Included in the Program Fee are the following:

- a. Eight private lessons on your first instrument.
- b. Room and Board (without linen service).
- c. Tuition for most elective classes; tuition for all required classes.
- d. Tickets to the final LSM Festival Week (two each for the three LSM Festival week concerts).
- e. Local telephone service in residence hall rooms. Telephone connections are supplied, students must bring, purchase or rent telephones.
- f. Use of campus recreational facilities.
- g. LSM 2001 T-shirt.
- h. Pastoral services as desired.

GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE

Early Application Discounts—Students may substantially reduce their camp costs by applying early. We are offering the following discount deadlines for LSM 2001:

All Alumni - application postmarked by January 30 (Save \$150)	
New Students - application postmarked by January 30 (Save \$125)	
All Students - application postmarked by March 15 (Save \$100)	
All Students - application deadline May 15	\$2,150

AAL Member Scholarships-To receive an AAL Member Scholarship of \$450 simply provide the student's AAL certificate number on item 15 of the Student Application. AAL members are those who have an AAL certificate through an insurance policy or annuity in the student's own name. These awards are distributed by LSM from scholarship funds generously donated by AAL, a fraternal benefit society, of Appleton, Wisconsin.

Incentive Grants and Local Matching Grants-LSM offers Incentive Grants for which students can qualify by matching them (on the basis of \$1.00 for every \$3.00 raised by the student from outside sources up to a maximum of \$200 for every \$600) with contributions from sponsors whom they contact. Under this offer, each qualifying student may receive up to \$200 in Incentive Grant funds from LSM for raising up to \$600 in Local Matching Grants (LMGs).

Scholarships-Many students can qualify for scholarship funds contributed to LSM by generous donors, including Lutheran Brotherhood, congregations, and individuals. Criteria include financial need, exceptional talent, and the student's ability to contribute to musical balance in camp ensembles. These awards will vary widely, depending upon the extent to which a student meets the several criteria.

Automatic Aid-All LSM students automatically receive substantial aid. Quality education is expensive and costs continue to rise. However, through funds generously provided by donors to Lutheran Music Program (\$1,850 per student), we are able to offer a program actually costing LMP \$4,000 per student to operate for the Program Fee of \$2,150.

Transportation Grant-Transportation Aid is available for students who must travel a great distance. Awards will be based upon distance, expected travel costs, financial need, and the number of students applying for these grants. Students living within 300 miles of camp are not eligible for transportation grants.

HOW TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Students who can attend Lutheran Summer Music only with financial assistance should:

- 1) Complete the financial aid application at the end of the brochure, including all signatures
- 2) Attach the financial aid application to your application for camp, including the \$100 deposit
- 3) Attach a copy of your parents' most recent IRS Form 1040 tax return.
- 4) Consider potential donors likely to sponsor your study at LSM

Guidelines for Obtaining Local Matching Grants

A number of organizations and individuals in your community and beyond may be willing to sponsor young persons for serious summer music study. Explain that a Local Matching Grant (LMG) may qualify you to receive an LMP Incentive Grant of one third of the amount of the contribution.

POTENTIAL SUPPORTERS MAY INCLUDE...

Your Congregation—Many congregations (both Lutherans and other denominations) have helped their members attend LSM because it is a Christian music camp of high quality.

Synod or District—Your synod or district may have scholarship funds available for your participation at LSM. Contact your local synod or district office for more information.

Local Groups—Local groups including your school, service clubs, community clubs, and music clubs may be willing to sponsor you.

Businesses—Some businesses will give student scholarships to contribute to the welfare of the entire community and maintain good relations with young people.

Individuals—Individuals, godparents, grandparents, or relatives outside your immediate family household who have an interest in music may be willing to sponsor your attendance at LSM.

Benefit Recitals—Increasingly, students are presenting benefit recitals as a means of telling others about the opportunities offered by LSM, demonstrating their musical talents, and inviting those who attend to sponsor them.

Student Earned Funds—Student-earned funds qualify for LMP Incentive Grant funds. This includes money earned at a part-time job or money received as a gift to the student.

If a student qualifies for an early application discount and/or a scholarship or grant-in-aid (other than a transportation grant) from Lutheran Music Program, Inc., the balance owed by the student is the Program Fee less the early application discount and/or the amount of aid awarded. The balance may be paid by any combination of student and sponsor funds.

Overpayment—No financial aid package may exceed the total cost of the program. Your financial aid package will be reduced accordingly.

Make check payable in US funds to "Lutheran Music Program, Inc." Please do not send cash. It is the responsibility of the student's parent/guardian to ensure that all fees are fully paid (from family or outside resources) by June 1, 2001. No deductions or refunds are made for late arrival, early departure, or in case of disciplinary separation of the student from the program.


