Morton performs with the Acadiana Symphony, the Rapides Symphony, the Louisiana Brass Quintet, the Praetorius Brass Ensemble, and the UL Faculty Jazz Combo. Over the past ten years, Morton has taught at Bemidji State University, the University of Alabama, and in the prestigious North Carolina Visiting Artist Program. Morton holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Alabama. Other degrees include the MM and BM from the North Carolina School of the Arts and an Artist Diploma from the Hartt School of Music. His major trumpet teachers were Ray Mase, Chris Gekker, Armando Ghitalla, Roger Murtha and Keig Garvin. Morton has taught trumpet and jazz studies at the Academy since 1996.
