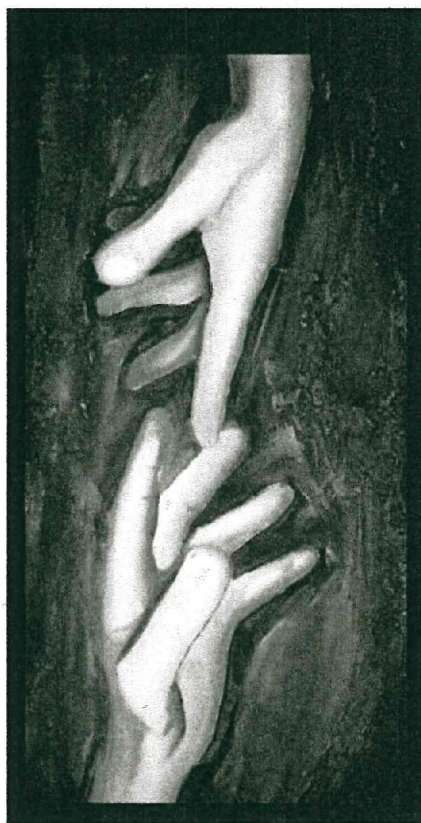

PSALM 25: 1 – 11 *Read responsively*

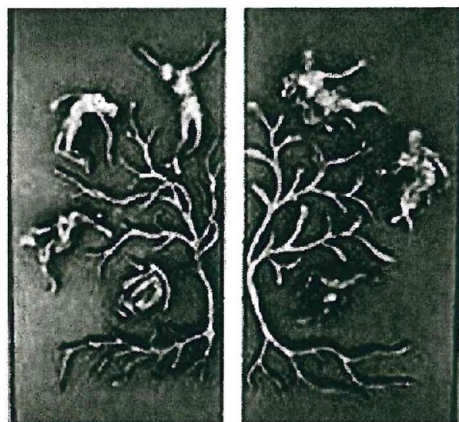

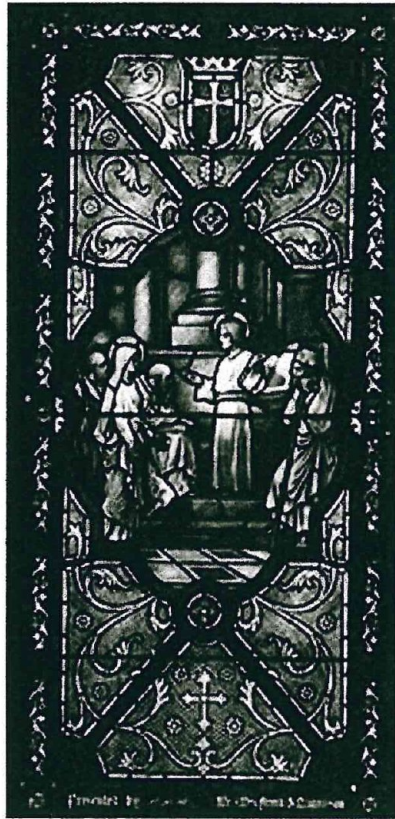
