

#### TREASURES OLD AND NEW: GRACE



Philipp Melanchthon, renewer of the church, died 1560 Though he died on April 19, Philipp Melanchthon is commemorar today because of his connection with the Augsburg Confession Colleague and co-reformer with Martin Luther, Melanchthon was brilliant scholar, known as "the teacher of Germany."

#### Presentation of the Augsburg Confession, 1530

On this day in 1530 the German and Latin editions of the Augsburg Confession w presented to the Emperor Charles of the Holy Roman Empire. The Augsbu Confession was written by Philipp Melanchthon and endorsed by Martin Luther, and consists of a brief summary of points in which the reformers saw their teaching either agreeing with or differing from that of the Roman Catholic Church of the time.

Treasures Old and New is the theme of worship as we celebrate the twenty-fig anniversary of Lutheran Summer Music. Tonight we give thanks for the God gift of GRACE made known to us in Christ Jesus. 


