Artist Biographies

Born in Chicago, Jeffery Meyer began his musical studies as a pianist, and shortly thereafter continued on to study composition and conducting. He is presently the Director of Orchestras at Ithaca College School of Music, as well as the founder and Artistic Director of the St. Petersburg Chamber Philharmonic in St. Petersburg, Russia. In the 2008-09 season, he will assume the position of Artistic Director of the Water City Chamber Orchestra, Northeast Wisconsin's only professional chamber orchestra.

Called "one of the most interesting and creatively productive conductors working in St. Petersburg" by Sergei Slonimsky, Jeff has been seen conducting, performing as piano soloist and chamber musician, as well as conducting from the keyboard in the United States, Canada, Russia, Italy, Spain, and Germany and has appeared with orchestras such as the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, Syracuse Symphony Orchestra, Cayuga Chamber Orchestra and the Orchestra Sinfonico "Haydn" di Bolzano e Trento. This summer he will appear with the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra, the premier orchestra of the Philippines. Recently he made his Glinka Hall conducting debut in the final concert of the 43rd St. Petersburg "Musical Spring" International Festival, featuring works by three of St. Petersburg's most prominent composers. He has been featured numerous times as both a conductor and pianist as part of the "Sound Ways" International New Music Festival in St. Petersburg, Russia. He was selected as a semifinalist in the 2004 Pedrotti International Competition for Conductors, a finalist in the 2003 Vakhtang Jordania International Conducting Competition, and a semi-finalist in the 2003 Beethoven Sonata International Piano Competition, Memphis, Tennessee.

Andrew D. Whitfield, baritone, enjoys a dynamic career as a performer, teacher, and stage director. In addition to appearances with Des Moines Metro Opera, Opera Southwest, and Pensacola Opera, Andrew has also been a resident artist with Portland Opera Works and has sung with educational outreach programs for Opera Birmingham and Opera Kansas. His most recent performance highlights include engagements with the Dubuque Symphony Orchestra, Cedar Rapids Opera Theatre, and the Peoria Bach Festival. Also active as a stage director, he directed "The Ballad of Baby Doe" for Utah State University in April 2006.

Originally from Shelbyville, Indiana, Andrew is a graduate of Butler University, Wichita State University, and Louisiana State University. He currently serves as Assistant Professor of Music at Luther College, where he teaches studio voice and opera performance. This is his third summer as a faculty member at Lutheran Summer Music Academy and Festival.

Although Austin Larson has only studied horn seriously for three years, he has quickly ascended through the ranks of high school horn players. Some of his previous accomplishments are: principal horn in the Wisconsin All-State band two years in a row, two-time Exemplary Soloist at State Solo and Ensemble, and finalist in the Fox Valley Young Artist Competition. In early May, he auditioned for the third horn position in the Fox Valley Symphony, where his current teacher, Dr. Bruce Atwell, plays principal and where his former teacher, Don Krause, played for 15 years. Austin was awarded runner-up in front of many college students and adult freelance hornists. As a result, he will be doing substitute work for the Fox Valley Symphony next year.

Next year, he will be a senior at Neenah High School in Neenah, Wisconsin. In school, Austin enjoys playing in the band and orchestra. He has also played in the pit orchestra for "Cats" and "Jekyll & Hyde." When Austin is not in school, he often plays his violin at weddings and other events with his string quartet. Austin is also a member of the International Horn Society and will attend their annual convention in Denver when LSM is finished.

Austin would like to thank his horn teachers, Don Krause and Bruce Atwell, as well as his parents and school music directors for all their support throughout the years. Austin would also like to thank the Neenah Music Parents and the Fox Valley Symphony for sponsoring him this year (his second) at LSM. Austin would especially like to thank LSM alumni Allison Jannette for informing him about LSM.
