Today's Liturgy
The mystery of God's ways is sometimes hidden from the wise and intelligent. Jesus associates with the lowly and those often excluded from the religious community. Like Paul, we struggle with our own selfish desires and seek God's mercy and forgiveness. We gather this day to be refreshed by Christ's invitation: "Come to me forgiveness. We gather this day to be refreshed by Christ's invitation: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens." In the Christian community gathered around word, water, and meal, we find rest for our souls.

### Music in the Service

Our music elaborates on the themes of today's gospel, in which Jesus reminds us of the rest, comfort, healing and forgiveness which is given to those who come to him. Our hymns explore these ideas, particularly the hymn of the day ("I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say," with a tune in the Phrygian mode by Thomas Tallis) and our hymn during communion, "If You But Trust in God to Guide You."

The anthem which the choir sings at the offering also reprises our gospel text. This setting of Matthew 11:28 was composed by Larry L. Fleming (1936-2003). A native of Cut Bank, Montana, Fleming was a composer, conductor, and church musician in the Lutheran church. At various points in his career, he served on the faculties of Concordia College (Moorhead), Valparaiso University, Augsburg College, Luther Seminary, and also founded the National Lutheran Choir, based in the Twin Cities.




