She has also been a soloist with the Tuscaloosa Symphony Orchestra and National Repertory Orchestra.

A native of Minneapolis, MN, **Katherine Vogele** currently serves as Principal Flute of the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Maestro Delta David Gier. Well known throughout the Midwest as an orchestral performer and chamber music collaborator, Katherine has performed as Principal Flute with the Minnesota Orchestra, the Festival of the Lakes Chamber Players, new music ensemble Harmonia Mundi and the acclaimed Dakota Wind Quintet. Ms. Vogele has concertized throughout the United States and abroad, includ Australia, Canada, Malaysia and New Zealand, and, most recently represented the United States as one of six flutists chosen for the American Flute Ensemble's France Tour. She has recorded for the Innova label and celebrates the recent release of a CD in collaboration with internationally acclaimed flutist and composer Gary Schocker. Formerly on the faculty of South Dakota State University, Katherine dedicates her energy and love of music to her private flute studio and is in her eighth exciting summer as a Faculty Artist with Lutheran Summer Music.

S. Blake Duncan, oboe, is concluding 15 years as a faculty member of Lutheran Summer Music and a member of the Movēre Woodwind Quintet. Since 1995 he has served as oboe instructor, chair of the woodwind faculty and as the Victor H. Mattfeld Director of the Collegium Musicum. During the year he has served as an adjunct faculty member in the Mu Department at Bradley University. He has performed as solo English hornist with the Peoria Symphony Orchestras, solo oboist with the Peoria BachFest, and with the Prairie Ensemble Chamber Orchestra as principal oboe. Beginning this fall Pastor Duncan, who is an ordaine ELCA pastor, will be serving as Pastor for Peace Lutheran Church in Steeleville, Illinois. Baruth, clarinet, was appointed Assistant Professor of Clarinet at Morehead State myersity in Morehead, Kentucky in 2007. Ms. Baruth received her Bachelor of Music and achelor of Music Education degrees from The Ohio State University (1999), her Master of fund degree from The Ohio State University (2004), and is currently completing her Doctor sical Arts degree from the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Inconnati. Her teachers have included Richie Hawley, Steve Cohen, James Pyne, Dr. Donald IcGinnis, Dr. Kathleen Gardiner, and Randy Riffle.

avid Oyen, bassoon, is Associate Professor of Music at Morehead State University. He uared bassoon with Robert Wisneskey, Gary Echols, Günter Pfitzenmaier, Stephan Krings nd Christopher Weait. He has performed with the Springfield (OH) Symphony Orchestra, plumbus (OH) Symphony Orchestra, the Lexington Philharmonic, the West Virginia hony, Kentucky Center Chamber Players, Seneca Chamber Orchestra and the Baird Vinds. Dr. Oyen has performed at International Double Reed Society Conferences in 1997, 001, 2003 and 2005.

Atwell, horn, has performed throughout the United States and Europe as an orchestral nusician and soloist. An Associate Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, Dr. Atwell maintains a busy teaching and performance schedule, with Principal positions with the Milwaukee Ballet Orchestra, the Green Bay Symphony, the Fox y Symphony, and as a member of the Milwaukee Horn Quartet. He has performed with the Florida Symphony, the Hong Kong Philharmonic, as Acting Fourth Horn with the 'hiladelphia Orchestra, and with numerous orchestras throughout the United States.

**Parr-Scanlin**, piano, is an assistant professor of music at West Texas A&M Iniversity in Canyon, Texas. She was formerly on the music faculties of North Georgia college and State University, Mercer University Atlanta, and the Georgia Governor's Honors am. This is her third summer at Lutheran Summer Music. Ms. Parr-Scanlin has given rous performances including recitals at the Fondation des Etats-Unis and the American hurch in Paris as well as guest artist appearances with the Atlanta Wind Quintet and Collage hamber Ensemble of Houston. As the recipient of the Harriet Hale Woolley scholarship, she id piano with Yvonne Loriod-Messiaen in Paris, France; she was also a student of Nadia nger at the American Conservatory of Music in Fontainebleau, France. She holds music egrees from the University of Georgia and, in 2005, completed the Doctor of Musical Arts egree from the University of Texas at Austin. This year she was an adjudicator for the Hong Schools Music Festival.


