*Always Advent***TODAY'S LITURGY**

In today's gospel reading, Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority to cast out demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them.

We, like the disciples, are also dependent on others: whether it is the emotional support of a family member, the compassion of a close friend or even the kindness of a stranger, the Holy Spirit works through our neighbors to help fulfill our needs. All of this is from God, whose grace comes to us anew in the Word and in the Meal, in our songs and in our prayers. As we gather for worship, we are *always preparing* to receive God's all-sufficient grace and love.

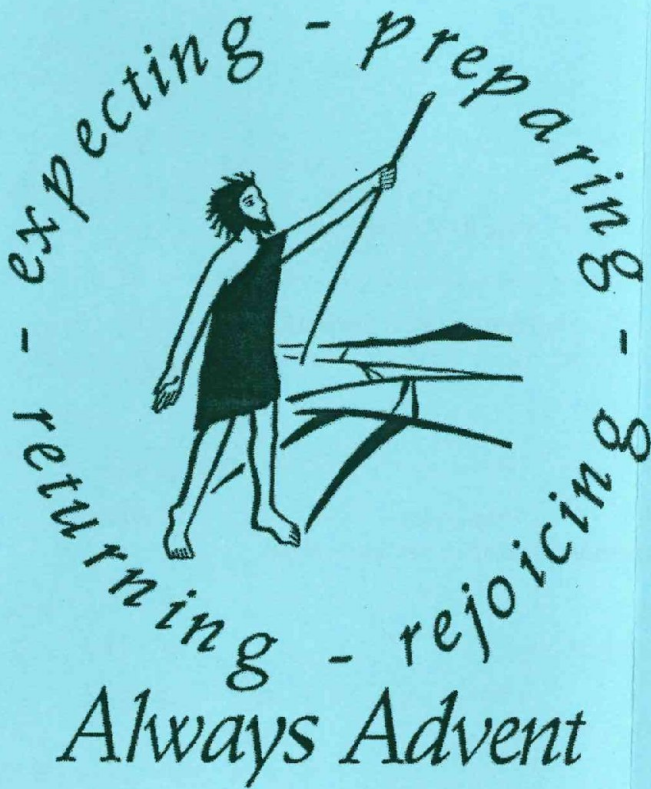
