TODAY'S SERVICE AND MUSIC

In Today's Old Testament reading the prophet Elijah anoints Elisha, calling him to service in the Lord's name. In the Gospel reading Jesus calls ordinary people to follow him and not look back. Following Jesus means journeying to Jerusalem, which means going with him all the way to the cross. In Christ's death on the cross we are freed from the power of sin and death to live as saints in the kingdom of God. In today's second reading St. Paul tells us what that looks like: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Today is also the commemoration of St. Cyril, Bishop of Alexandria, who died in 444 after a lifetime of defending orthodox teachings about the person of Christ.

Our worship music this morning juxtaposes texts and melodies from saints of all times and places. Today's hymn tunes come from Lutheran cantors of sixteenth-century Germany—Philipp Nicolai (ELW 786), Johann Hermann Schein and Bartholomaus Gesius (ELW 799)—as well as Swiss Geneva (ELW 783) and twentieth-century Liberian composer Billema Kwillia (ELW 491). The Chapel Choir's contributions include works by Mendelssohn, Scotsman John Bell, and contemporary American composers Ralph M. Johnson and John Folkening. Our setting of the liturgy, ELW Setting 3, was composed by Richard Hillert, who wrote many works for Lutheran Summer Music, and who died in 2010.






