along the Milky Way.

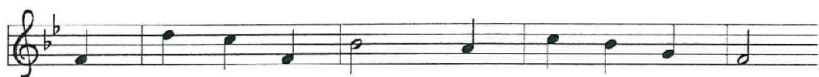

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

through Christ our Lord. To you, O Lord.

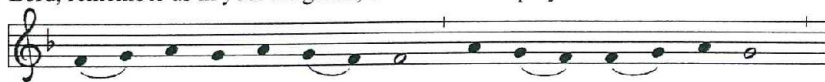

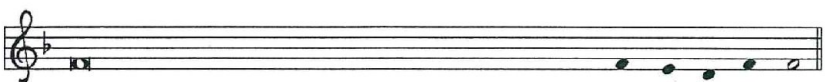
