TODAY'S SERVICE AND MUSIC

The mystery of God's ways is sometimes hidden from the wise and intelligent. Jesus associates with the lowly and the outcast. Like Paul in today's second reading, we struggle with our own selfish desires and seek God's mercy and forgiveness. We assemble today to be refreshed by Christ's invitation: "Come to me, all you that are weary." Gathered around word, water, and meal, we find rest for our souls and strength for the work of our daily lives.

This morning's prelude and worship music highlight artistic contributions from the United States. All of the *Morgenmusik* pieces are by American composers, and all of today's liturgical music and hymns feature texts and/or tunes of American origin. Of particular note: Our opening hymn (*Voices Raised to You*), whose tune was composed by Carolyn Jennings, Professor Emeritus at St. Olaf College, on a text by the late Herman Stuempfle, Jr., a pastor and former president of the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. Today's psalm setting was composed by Mark Mummert, Director of Worship at Christ the King Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas. The hymn of the day (*Come to Me, All Pilgrims Thirsty*) is a *Sacred Harp* tune with a recent text by Delores Dufner, a Benedictine nun from St. Joseph, Minnesota. The arrangement was composed by Zebulon Highben for LSM's 25th annual Festival of Hymns. These musical selections help us remember that the "new song" the Church is called to sing is ever-renewed by the work of poets, composers, pastors, and musicians.
