Samuel Nordlund is an active cellist and teacher in Birmingham, AL. He is music director of Scrollworks, where he teaches cello and conducts the Metropolitan Youth Orchestra and Scrollworks Strings. This fall, he will begin serving as cello faculty and member of the faculty quartet at Samford University. Nordlund earned his M.M. at Northwestern University, where he studied with Hans Jensen. He is currently completing his D.M.A at the University of Alabama, where he studies with Carlton McCreery and is a member of the graduate Capstone Quartet. He has taught at the Music Institute of Chicago and the Meadowmount School.

Rolf Erdahl teaches bass at Luther and Gustavus Adolphus colleges, subs with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, and performs in the Vecchione/Erdahl Duo with his wife, oboist Carrie Vecchione. Previously principal bass of the Winnipeg Symphony and Manitoba Chamber Orchestra, Erdahl was also a member of the Honolulu Symphony, Breckenridge Music Festival, Fort Wayne Philharmonic, Bergen Philharmonic, and New World Symphony. He was a Fulbright and Scandinavian-American Foundation scholar for Grieg studies in Norway. Major teachers include Eugene Levinson, Peter Lloyd, Bruce Bransby, and Paul Ellison. He holds degrees from St. Olaf College (B.A.), University of Minnesota (M.M.), and Peabody Conservatory (D.M.A.).
