TODAY'S SERVICE AND MUSIC

In today's gospel reading Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it must all be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them.

When we are sent out from worship to witness and to heal, we are also asked to be vulnerable and dependent upon the reception of others. Nevertheless, we do not go out untethered—we are anchored by and built upon the love and mercy of Christ. The Holy Spirit works to maintain and strengthen these bonds: between Jesus and us, within our community of faith, and between us and those to whom we are sent.

Today's service music highlights the work of twentieth and twenty-first century composers and poets. Nearly all the hymns in today's worship feature contemporary texts and tunes, while the Chapel Choir's offertory anthem and the handbell choir selections are older tunes arranged by twentieth-century composers. Both the Psalm and the Gospel Acclamation were set by Michael D. Costello especially for our service this morning at Lutheran Summer Music.

If medical/health concerns give you reason to avoid the wine or bread, please remember the teaching of the Christian Church that Christ is fully present in either element alone, bread or wine. Those with a gluten allergy may ask the communion server for a gluten-free host.
