He has mer-cy on those who fear— him in ev-'ry gen-er-a-tion.




He has shown the strength of his arm; he has scat-tered the proud in their conceit.




He has cast down the might-y from their thrones, and has lift-ed up the low-ly.





He has come to the help of his ser-vant Is-ra-el, for he has re-




mem-bered his prom-ise of mer-cy, the prom-ise he made to our fore-bears,
