

We in the extended LSM community are busy people. Today's gospel reminds us of our struggle: when do we ever simply rest in God's presence? In our gospel Christ addresses Martha's busyness, worry, and distraction, alongside Mary's contemplation, focus, and desire to sit at the feet of Jesus. But is "quietly sitting" even possible for us?

Perhaps we can find a helpful model in Abraham who rests in the heat of the day. In that time of rest, he received the three unexpected guests who came bearing the news that Sarah would have a son, fulfilling God's promise given years earlier. His guests had Abraham's undivided attentio

As we prepare to return to our homes and families, jobs and routines, God's transformational message comes with us. We are not the same people who arrived at LSM four weeks ago. Through Abraham and Sarah you promised to bless all nations. You rescued Israel, your chosen people.



This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.


