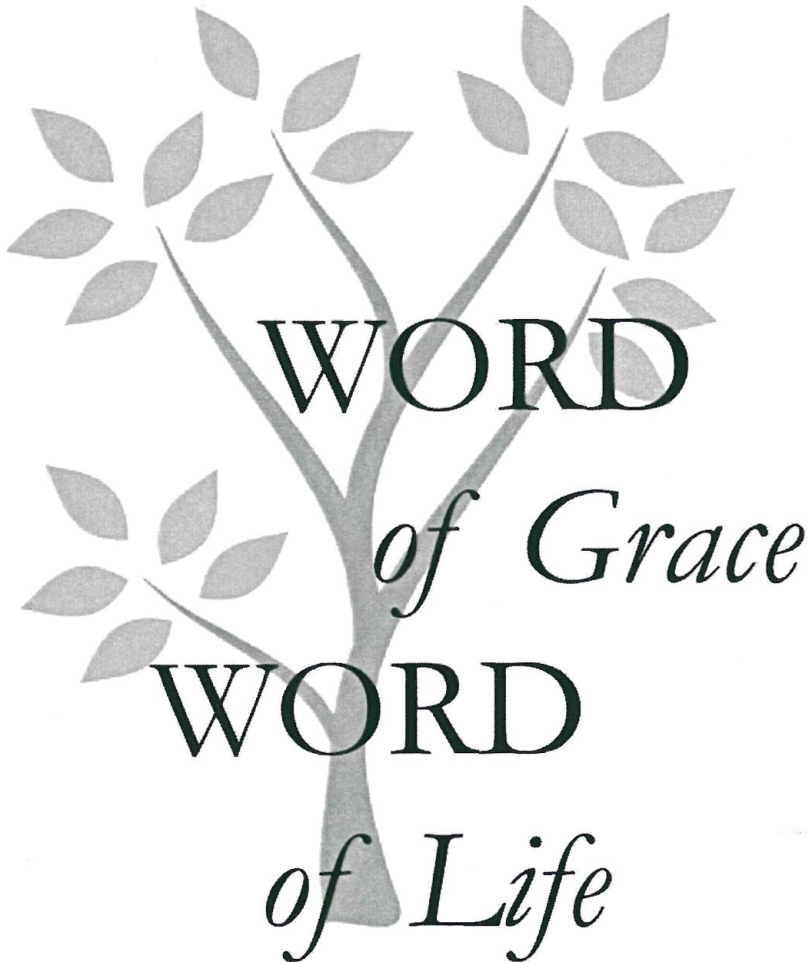

Today's Service

We in the extended LSM community are busy people. Today's gospel reminds us of our struggle: when do we ever simply rest in God's presence? In our gospel Christ addresses Martha's busyness, worry, and distraction, alongside Mary's contemplation, focus, and desire to sit at the feet of Jesus. But is "quietly sitting" even possible for us?

Perhaps we can find a helpful model in Abraham who rests in the heat of the day. In that time of rest, he received the three unexpected guests who came bearing the news that Sarah would have a son, fulfilling God's promise given years earlier. His guests had Abraham's undivided attention.

As we prepare to return to our homes and families, jobs and routines, God's transformational message comes with us. We are not the same people who arrived at LSM four weeks ago. Nor do we return to the same world we left. God is always at work making us new: raising up hope, possibility and promise. With expectant hearts and open, waiting lives we will receive God's renewal each and every day from Jesus: Word of Grace. Word of Life.
