OH, PRAISE THE GRACIOUS POWER

*Oh, praise the gracious pow'r
That tumbles walls of fear
And gathers in one house of faith

In anticipation of next year's 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, we consider the reforming work of the Spirit through the cross of Christ.

At the heart of the Christian faith is the reformation of the human heart, made possible through Christ's death and resurrection and enacted in the life of each Christian and in the Christian assembly through water, meal, and word.

The reforming work of the Spirit through the cross of Christ forms the church to be a people and sends us out to be the hands, feet, and voice of God in the world.

In a human community broken by sin, a brokenness evidenced by wars, injustice, and oppression, God calls us to be reconciled to one another. The reforming work of the Spirit through the cross of Christ calls us to be neighbor and to restore the brokenness of the human community.

Brokenness goes beyond the human community to a creation marred and scarred by human carelessness. The reforming work of the Spirit through the cross of Christ calls us to care for creation and to be a restorative presence in the world.

NOTE ON THE FESTIVAL SETTING

The festive setting of the liturgical music this morning was premiered by Lutheran Summer Music, July 13, 2000, at Rockefeller Chapel, on the campus of the University of Chicago. The setting combines music from both Richard Hillert's and Ronald Nelson's setting of the liturgy, which were both published in 1978, and continue now in the Lutheran Service Book, and Evangelical Lutheran Worship, both published in 2006. Robert Buckley Farlee wrote the festive setting for choir and congregation, handbell choir, band, organ, and percussion. We are pleased to bring it back to LSM this morning.
